

ADAMCZAK, Kazimierz (Kaz)

Born: March 4, 1954, Leszno, Poland.

Died: October 31, 1994

Kaz was one of four young Polish riders to be allocated to British clubs as the Poles looked to expand the experience of some of their brightest prospects and the British clubs looked for added strength. Kaz was originally bound for Hackney but when the 'Hawks' promoter Len Silver successfully negotiated the return of Zenon Plech to Waterden Road, Kaz was surplus to requirements and started the season with Hull. He made just one league appearance for the 'Vikings' before switching to Exeter who had suffered an injury to their second string Mike Farrell.

Kaz found the going tough at the County Ground and on 13 appearances for the club he had a top score of just three, paid four and the club soon turned to Steve Koppe, on loan at Canterbury, with Kaz filling in when Koppe was unavailable. Eventually, he moved away from Exeter and ended his one and only British season in the colours of Newport with whom he showed much brighter form before returning to Poland to resume his career with his home town club, Unia Leszno.
