

ADAWAY, Patrick Ronald (Pat)

Born: August 16, 1944, Surrey, England.

A London based junior who was a second half rider at Hackney and Wimbledon, Pat finally broke into the sport after a couple of years of trying when he was named in the Canterbury side to race against Middlesbrough in the Division Two Knock-Out Cup semi-final in September, 1968. He scored five, paid six, but lost his place immediately afterwards and did not appear for the 'Crusaders' again. When Ivor Brown and Vic White reopened Long Eaton in 1969 after a season of absence Pat was named in the starting line-up and held his place for much of the season until a pulled thigh muscle cost him his team place and he was unable to fight his way back into the reckoning. His best performance had come with a reserve's paid maximum at Station Road against Nelson on May 29 alongside a third place in the Ace of Herts individual event at Rye House the following month.
