

AMOR, Max George**Born:** January 10, 1947, New Plymouth, New Zealand.***Died:** November 11, 2009.

Max began riding in New Zealand as a teenager and was rated as a top prospect at Auckland in the 1965-66 season. He made his first trip to England in 1970 and was recommended to the Wally Mawdsley promotion by his fellow countryman Bill Andrew, making his first appearance in the Jack Unstead Memorial Trophy at Exeter on May 4. Max struggled to find a team place in the U.K. and his only official appearance came when he turned out for Reading at Swindon on April 3, 1971 - the 'Racers' first ever match in Division One after their promotion the previous winter. The club were without Anders Michanek and Richard May for this meeting and used Max to fill a gap at the bottom end of the side. He failed to score from two rides and did not appear in league racing again.
