

BALDOCK, Peter**Born:** c. 1948, Australia.

Based in Adelaide, Peter was an unlucky rider who first came to Britain in 1968 and had second half rides at Wimbledon and Exeter whilst residing with Jimmy Squibb. His initial stay was curtailed by a car accident and the leg injuries he suffered in the smash were serious enough for him to have to return home. He was back again for another try in 1970 and linked up with Glasgow with whom he had a short run but, after scoring just two points in five meetings, he was dropped and sent out on loan to Berwick to gain more experience in the Second Division. Going well, he scored paid ten on his 'Bandits' debut and looked set for a successful time at Shielfield Park, but a broken wrist struck at exactly the wrong time and he missed the rest of the year. Peter started the 1971 season with league newcomers Hull but quit after losing his place in the side in mid-season.
