

BARCLAY, Terence George (Terry)

Born: December 20, 1956, Dagenham, Essex, England.

The son of George Barclay, Terry was one of the few riders to race in the same team as his father when the pair represented Sunderland during the 1973 season. He was just 16 years old at the time of his debut and also had an outing for Hackney in Division One in his initial season. His first appearance for Sunderland came in the opening fixture of the season at Boston but he was dropped for the next match, at home to Stoke, as skipper Russ Dent returned to the side. However, the visiting heat leaders Mike Broadbank and Mick Handley broke down en route and Terry was drafted into the Stoke side to make up the numbers. He top scored for his temporary team and was immediately restored to the Sunderland side, holding his team place for the majority of the rest of the season, with his best score of 14 points from five rides coming in the home match against Ellesmere Port.

He was on the move to Canterbury, much closer to his Essex home, in 1974 but endured a miserable season at Kingsmead as he was injured early in the campaign and made only three appearances all year for the 'Crusaders'. Despite spells at Crayford and Eastbourne in 1975, Terry never recovered the promising form he had shown at Sunderland and drifted out of the sport.
