

BERTHELSEN, Kiehn

Born: May 8, 1925, Denmark.

Kiehn was the first Dane to ride in post-war league racing in Britain and was rated as the number one rider in his native land. He had already won the first of his three Danish titles before coming to Britain in 1952 and was initially targeted by Belle Vue during an injury crisis in Manchester. That move came to nothing but he did eventually arrive in Division One later that year as Norwich sought to strengthen a team languishing at the foot of the table.

Sadly, Kiehn failed to settle to the rigours of league racing and scored just eleven points in his eight meetings for the 'Stars'. Although this was the last British fans saw of Kiehn, he remained a force to be reckoned with on the Continent and secured two further Danish titles.
