

## **BLACKBURN, Glyn**

**Born:** England.

Glyn appeared in second half events at Halifax in the late 1960s and was given his first chance in league racing with Crewe when the 'Kings' opened their Earle Street track in 1969. He was in the side right from the beginning and rode in the first two away matches before losing his place to the new signing from Middlesbrough, Paul O'Neil. He reclaimed his team spot later in the season and certainly knew the fastest way around the massive Crewe circuit, scoring six points against Canterbury and paid nine against Romford before suffering a broken wrist just when he was getting into his stride. He had a longer run in the team in 1970 but, despite averaging over five points per match, had to make way when Dave Parry returned from injury and did not feature again after the end of June.
