

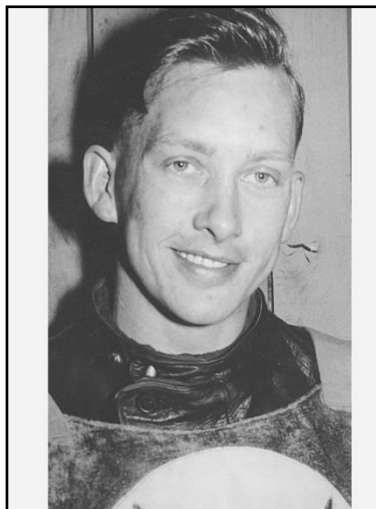
BRADBURY, Stanley (Stan)

Born: December 18, 1926, Stockport, Greater Manchester, England.*

Yet another Tiger Stevenson Training School product in the post-war years, Stan eventually forced his way into the Stoke team in 1948, and helped the 'Potters' to the Third Division title the following year with some solid scoring from reserve.

He struggled to hold his team place when the club were promoted to Division Two in 1950 and eventually figured in a move to Motherwell. After making 56 appearances for the Lanarkshire side, Stan returned to the Midlands to sign for Wolverhampton and ended his league career with a short spell with the ill-fated Liverpool side of 1953.

He continued to practice at Belle Vue and Ainsdale Sands before leaving to live in Canada in 1957. Stan raced speedway in his new homeland for many years, helping to form the Canadian Speedway Riders Association, and finally retired from racing at the age of 55 in 1982.
