

BROWN, Cecil

Born: December 23, 1902, Manistique, Michigan, United States of America.

Cecil started racing motorcycles at the age of 16 in 1919 on the tracks of the U.S.A. and went to Australia in the mid-1920s, introducing the Australians to the art of broadsiding. He was to win the first Australian solo national championship in 1926 and came to the U.K. in 1928, riding extensively on the London tracks. He tended to struggle slightly on the smaller British circuits, but was still a quality performer and was one of the most experienced men around.

When league racing was introduced in 1929, the star riders were not permitted to take part but the rule was relaxed and Cecil was named in the Wimbledon side from mid-June. He was not a dominant figure in league racing but was unbeaten in home fixtures against White City and West Ham. Cecil was an expert mechanic as well as being a fine rider and spent just two years in the U.K.
