

COX, Keith J.**Born:** January 16, 1923, Brisbane, Queensland, Australia.**Died:** December 20, 2011

Keith first rode at Brisbane straight after the war and came to the U.K. in 1948 after being recommended to Newcastle by their Aussie international, Charlie Spinks. Rejected by the Brough Park club, Keith joined Edinburgh and spent most of the season at reserve, posting a top score of seven in his penultimate appearance for the 'Monarchs' at Fleetwood. The fans at Old Meadowbank were never to see his undoubted scoring ability as, after his wife became pregnant in the close season, he decided to remain Down Under. He made his test debut against England at Brisbane in January 1950 and continued to race in his home country until 1958.
