

CREASOR, Walter Cuthbert

Born: October 31, 1902, Middlesbrough, Cleveland, England.

Died: 1975.

The younger brother of Fred Creasor, Walter was a former professional footballer who was on the books at Middlesbrough, without making a league appearance for the Ayresome Park club. He later moved to Darlington where he played in the outside-left position and made six appearances in the Third Division North, scoring one goal.

After his football career ended, Walter took up competitive motorcycling and competed on sand and grass as well as being a hill-climb rider. He started his speedway career in 1928 when the sport was introduced to his home town but, like his brother Fred, he was in the Newcastle team when the sport adopted league racing in 1929. Walter was the number one with Newcastle that year and, at times, showed unbeatable form, being amongst the top riders in the English Dirt-Track League. Some of his peers went on to become household names and international riders and it was certainly possible that the Teesside based rider could have being ranked in the same category. However, prior to the 1930 season Walter was married and decided to pursue a career in the family butcher's business.
