

CULLIS, Thomas Charles (Tommy)

Born: June 3, 1907, Coventry, Warwickshire, England.

Despite just being 22 years of age when he started his speedway career in 1928, he was an experienced all round motor-cyclist and made a good impression when he started to appear at Southampton late into the 1928 season. When league racing began, Tommy remained at Banister Court and was part of the side that competed in the Southern League that year. Tommy was superb around his home track and at times showed unbeatable form, recording maximums against Crystal Palace, Lea Bridge, Wimbledon and Harringay. His average that year was over nine points per match but he missed the end of the season through injury and wasn't part of the side the following year. He was, however, seen in various open meetings until August 1930 when his career was ended following a crash at Portsmouth where he tragically lost the sight in an eye.
