

FYNN, George Edward (Huck)

Born: April 28, 1924, Sydney, New South Wales, Australia.

Huck hailed from Sydney and travelled to the U.K. in 1949 with Wimbledon captain Norman Parker. He subsequently joined the 'Dons' and fluctuated between the reserve berth and second half events at Plough Lane, making 16 appearances in seven separate spells during the season. He showed some flickers of promising form, including his best performance in official matches when he recorded a score of six, paid seven from three rides at home to Belle Vue in the quarter finals of the National Trophy. He also scored two race wins at home to West Ham, beating international riders Malcolm Craven and Cliff Watson in the process, but suffered a knee injury at the peak of his form. He rode for the 'Dons' in the early season Spring Cup matches in 1950 as well as a brief spell at Norwich and, although he did not compete in league speedway again, Huck settled in Stratford-upon-Avon and was a famed builder and designer of speedway frames.
