

GREGORY, Reginald George (Reg)

Born: September 14, 1917, Bradford-on-Avon, Wiltshire, England.*

Died: 1985.

A flight engineer on a war time bomber, Reg attended the Bristol Training School at the end of the hostilities and was signed by Stoke to compete in the newly formed Third Division. An ever present in 1947, Reg proved to be a fine middle order rider in the 'Potters' team and twice recorded double figure scores at Sun Street in matches against Exeter and Wombwell. He finished the season having scored almost 150 points and was expected to become one of the stars of the division in his second season, but crashed with team mate Will Gordon in Stoke's opening meeting of 1948 and suffered a career ending broken leg. He took up the post of assistant team manager at Sun Street for a time but was unable to return to the saddle on a regular basis, making only a handful of appearances in second half events.
