

HANCOX, John Thomas B.

Born: June 7, 1916, Birmingham, West Midlands, England.*

Died: November 1984.

Birmingham born John overcame a sight threatening injury whilst road racing at Donnington to pursue a speedway career. He rode on the Army tracks in Italy with the likes of Split Waterman and joined Exeter in 1948 where he spent most of the season in second half events, making just seven appearances for the side. Slightly more success followed in 1949 when he started the season in the team and eleven appearances brought an average approaching five points per match. However, he was to lose his place early in May and drifted out of the side. He reappeared in early season matches for Plymouth in 1951 but failed to hold his place until the start of the league campaign.
