

JACKSON, Alec

Born: January 25, 1898, Morton, West Yorkshire, England.

Alec was a pioneer rider and first appeared at Audenshaw on March 3, 1928. He rode at various northern tracks in that season, appearing at places like Belle Vue, Blackpool and Salford and was a member of the Bolton side that took the track for the first time for the meeting against Preston in the English Dirt-Track League of 1929. When Bolton withdrew from the league after just one fixture, he made the short journey to Manchester White City where he rode in the early season fixtures.

At the end of 1929 Alec crashed at Belle Vue and suffered a broken leg and a fractured skull which ended his career at the age of 31 but he remained in the sport in a managerial role. He took over as manager of Leicester Super in 1931 and was the long term manager of the Wembley 'Lions' when the club had a long run of post-war success.
