

KIDD, Jack H.

Born: circa 1913, Australia.

Jack was one of an influx of Australian riders to join Tamworth on their entry into league racing in 1947. Despite flashes of form and a top score of five, paid six, at Cradley Heath he struggled to adapt to British tracks and was further hampered by a broken collarbone suffered at his home circuit in July. In all Jack made just ten appearances for the 'Hounds' before drifting away from the club. He remained in Britain for the 1948 season but was mainly occupied with the technical side of the sport, specialising in frame building. He was based at Wimbledon and kept in trim with second half races at Plough Lane and made one appearance for the 'Dons' when Alec Statham was unavailable for a match at West Ham in August.
