

LEETE, Johnny

Johnny was an early pioneer, who initially rode Coventry in 1928 and later appeared at Blackbird Road, Leicester. As far as league racing goes, Johnny is believed to have appeared in just one league meeting – for Wimbledon against Wembley on August 12, 1929 and it was for his mechanical work that he was most renowned. Johnny was a qualified chemist and had also studied engineering in Leeds, becoming an expert in engine building and mechanic for England's top star of the time, Jim Kempster. He later worked for Arthur Jervis and became team mechanic for Leicester Super in 1931.
