

MODRAL, Harry

Born: Newcastle, Tyne & Wear, England.

An occasional performer for Newcastle in the Northern League and Division Two, Harry found slightly more success on moving south to Wombwell in the Third Division in July 1947. A top score of nine, paid eleven, against Exeter at Station Road was the highlight of his nine match spell with the 'Colliers' that year but he sustained a foot injury early in the 1948 season, causing him to miss six weeks of action, and lost his place after failing to score in four successive matches on his return to the side.
