

NICHOLLS, Stanley (Ginger)

Born: September 1, 1927, Edmonton, London, England.*

Ginger was a Londoner who had spells with Poole and Bristol in 1948, showing a great deal of promise in his eight outings for the 'Pirates' before spending the rest of the year at a higher level with the 'Bulldogs'. He made just one appearance for the powerhouse Bristol side in 1949 and it was little surprise when he was loaned out to non-league newcomers Swindon during the season. The opening day at the Blunsdon track coincided with Ginger's wedding day and he rushed from the altar to the track in time to win the first ever race at the Abbey Stadium and score eleven points on the night. By the time Swindon were admitted to the league two months later, Ginger had completely lost form and never rode for the 'Robins' in a league fixture.
