

PENNELL, Stan

Born: England.

A north-east based junior, Stan made his debut for Middlesbrough in a National Trophy match against Birmingham in May 1946 but spent the rest of the season with near neighbours Newcastle. He was in and out of the team at Brough Park that year and had a top score of three in a home match against Sheffield in September. He started the 1947 season in the side but was dropped after five unsuccessful matches and tried his luck at Hull when racing was introduced to the East Yorkshire venue in 1948. He lost his team place before the league programme began but retained his interest in the sport, making a surprise comeback in the early 1960s when he competed in second half races at Brough Park.
