

**ROSENFELD, Albert (Aussie)**

**Born:** 1914, Huddersfield, West Yorkshire, England.\*

**Died:** July 16, 1946.

A pre-war Belle Vue junior and West Yorkshire garage owner, 'Aussie' made his first league appearance for Bradford at New Cross on May 1, 1946. He rode in nine consecutive league and cup matches, averaging just less than three points per match and achieving a top score of six, paid nine, against West Ham at his home circuit. However, during an A.C.U. Cup match against Belle Vue at Odsal on July 6, he hit the fence after clipping the rear wheel of Harold Jackson's machine and sustained a fractured skull. He was taken to hospital and was reported to have briefly regained consciousness, but died ten days later following the onset of pneumonia. He was 32 years old.
